II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES.

III. REVIEWING OF APPLICATIONS.

A. APPLICATION FOR NEW PERMITS.

1. <u>Witzend.</u> Ms. Kim Broadwater, Owner, was sworn in and stated she was rebranding her business at this location, noting there was going to be local art and music along with food and beer. Ms. Broadwater stated she plans to open in mid-April on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays only. Ken Weems reported no zoning issues and Chief Quillin confirmed no problems with the background check.

He stated he owned this Johnson City based business with his wife as a majority and there were 35 other owners who each owned less than five percent. Mr. Latham explained the intention was to manufacture only out of space at Gypsy Circus and possibly collaborate with them on occasion. Ken Weems reported no zoning issues. Chief Quillin confirmed there were no problems with the background check.
