II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES.

Motion/Second: Forrester/McKinley to approve the minutes of the June 7, 2022 regular business meeting.

III. REVIEWING OF APPLICATIONS.

A. SPECIAL EVENT PERMITS.

1. Greater Kingsport Boys & Girls Club Foundation Ms. Anne Beckelman was sworn in and provided details on this event noting this raffle and BBQ dinner has taken place for a few years and nothing is changing. She stated you must be 21 to purchase a ticket and there will be a police presence. Planning Manager Weems reported no zoning issues. Commander Chambers confirmed no problems with the background.

Motion/Second: LaHair/Forrester:

To issue a Special Event Beverage Permit to the **Greater Kingsport Boys & Girls Club Foundation** for the **Last Man Standing** event taking place on August 5, 2022 from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at St. Dominic Catholic Church Family Life Center at 2517 John B. Dennis Highway, Kingsport.

Approved: All present voting "aye."

2. Kingsport Chamber Ms. Stephanie Hernandez, was sworn in and provided details on this event confirming it was the same set up as last year. Planning Manager Weems reported no zoning issues and Commander Chambers confirmed no problems with the background check.

Motion/Second: McKinley/LaHair:

To issue a Special Event Beverage Permit to the ***Kingsport Chamber*** for the ***BrewHaHa*** event taking place on August 12, 2022 from 6:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at Meadowview Convention Center at 1901 Meadowview Parkway, Kingsport.

Approved: All present voting “aye.”

B. NEW PERMITS.

1. Anchored Mfg. Mr. David Saylor, Owner, was sworn in and provided information on his business since resubmitting his application from the last meeting. City Attorney Rowlett confirmed the discrepancies had been resolved. Mr. Saylor provided details on serving beer, noting they will ID everyone at the point of sale. Planning Manager Weems reported no zoning issues and Commander Chambers confirmed no problems with the background check.

Motion/Second: Forrester/McKinley:

To issue an On Premises Beverage Permit to ***Anchored Mfg.*** for ***Anchored*** located at 113 East Market Street in Kingsport.

Approved: All present voting “aye.”

IV. UNFINISHED BUSINESS.

A. PENDING PERMITS. City Clerk Marshall confirmed Market Street Social Club turned in their health permit and picked up their license.

V. NEW BUSINESS.

A. REVIEW OF ARRESTS/INCIDENT REPORTS. None.

B. SUNDAY SERVING HOUR RECOMMENDATION. City Attorney Rowlett informed the board the city opted out of expanding the hours in 2001 and the city would first have to opt back in via resolution before the hours could be amended. Discussion ensued regarding the pros and cons of aligning the beer sales with wine sales versus other scenarios and what businesses would be affected by the changes. Mr. LaHair made a motion, seconded by Mr. McKinley to recommend to the Board of Mayor and Alderman amending the Sunday serving hours to begin at 10am. (No beer sales on Sunday from 3am to 10am and 2am to 8am during the week.) All present voting “aye.”
