1. **Economic Development Update on Downtown Initiatives**

Economic Development Director John Rose gave a presentation highlighting current projects, including Pappy's, Kingsport Grocery, Citizen Supply and the Dobyys-Taylor Warehouse. The city manager noted this last project has resulted after a lot of work with the family but is a great opportunity. He also provided details on redevelopment in downtown which would require the city to surplus a parking lot on New Street. He pointed out the location supports existing and future projects as well. Discussion followed.




