I. Call to Order: Chairman Paul Montgomery called the meeting to order.

II. General Information/Attendance Roll Call: The meeting was held in-person with optional live public access available via Zoom Webinar. A video/audio recording of the meeting is published online at <u>https://www.kingsporttn.gov/city-services/kmtpo/meetings-notices/agenda-minutes/</u>.

Attendance was taken by roll call.

- **III. Public Comment:** Chairman Paul Montgomery invited members of the public to address comments related to agenda items or transportation planning issues, activities, or projects that pertain to the Kingsport Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization. No comments.
- **IV. Approval of Minutes:** The minutes of the May 9, 2024 meeting were reviewed. No corrections and/or additions were suggested. A motion was made by Ambre Torbett to

approve the minutes and was seconded by Blake Ailor. The motion carried unanimously.

V. New Business:

- A. <u>Update on TIP Amendment #3 from May Meeting</u>. Presented by Lesley Phillips. The 10-day public review period was held May 9 through May 18. No comments were received. The amendment was officially adopted effective May 20, 2024. No further Board action is required for this item.
- B. <u>Statewide Household Travel Survey</u>. Presented by Lesley Phillips. This is not a typical survey and is very specialized and in depth. The survey analyzes trends in personal and household travel. It includes daily non-commercial travel by all modes, including characteristics of the people traveling, their household, and their vehicles. Who is traveling, when they travel, where they are going, why they go there and how they get there. Most TN MPOs have decided to participate in the actual survey. Kingsport MTPO survey cost is estimated to be \$125,000 \$150,000. The cost will be split 80% Federal from the PL funds balance, which is separate from our UPWP programmed funds. TDOT is going to pay the 20% match. There is no Board action expected unless an amendment is required to the UPWP. No Board action required for this item.
- C. TDOT Statewide Partnership Program Presentation. Presented by Troy Ebbert. Following the passage of the 2023 Transportation Modernization Act, the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) released its first fiscally constrained 10-Year Project Plan. This new process represents an evolution in philosophy at TDOT regarding how transportation projects are funded and delivered. TDOT has taken a critical eve to their projects statewide with the mindset of "what gets started, gets finished" to better serve Tennessee with greater accountability and communication. As part of TDOT's 10-Year Project Planning process, the Statewide Partnership Program (SPP) is a critical avenue for local stakeholders to provide input on their priorities to better inform the annual reassessment of TDOT's 10-Year Project Plan. The program supports local authorities in maximizing funding dollars for critical local mobility and economic development needs. TDOT is committed to working with Tennessee's local jurisdictions, municipalities, and counties, through their respective MPOs and RPOs to identify priorities and accelerate projects with identified local funding and support. Accordingly, all submissions gathered through this process will be evaluated for inclusion in TDOT's updated 10-Year Project Plan, which will be released in December 2024. All project proposals will be evaluated based on performance, deliverability, and cost. TDOT intends to prioritize projects that are MPO and RPO priorities and represent a significant financial investment by locals with funds that efficiently leverage non-state funding sources. The SPP is primarily meant as a first step in the planning process to gather data on local needs, priorities, and ability to partner with TDOT. Think of this new process as "open enrollment" for TDOT projects; rather than communities advocating for their priorities at disparate and ad-hoc times throughout the year, this structure allows for standardized information to be provided during a specific period. While submissions gathered are not guaranteed to receive funding, all information provided is essential in the development of future 10-Year Plans and for TDOT to better understand, and further communicate, the outstanding critical transportation funding needs in Tennessee. No Board action required for this item.

VI. FEDERAL & STATE PARTNER UPDATES/PROJECT UPDATES

Updates and information were provided by TDOT, DRPT, the Tri-City Airport, and local transit representatives. Project updates were also provided.

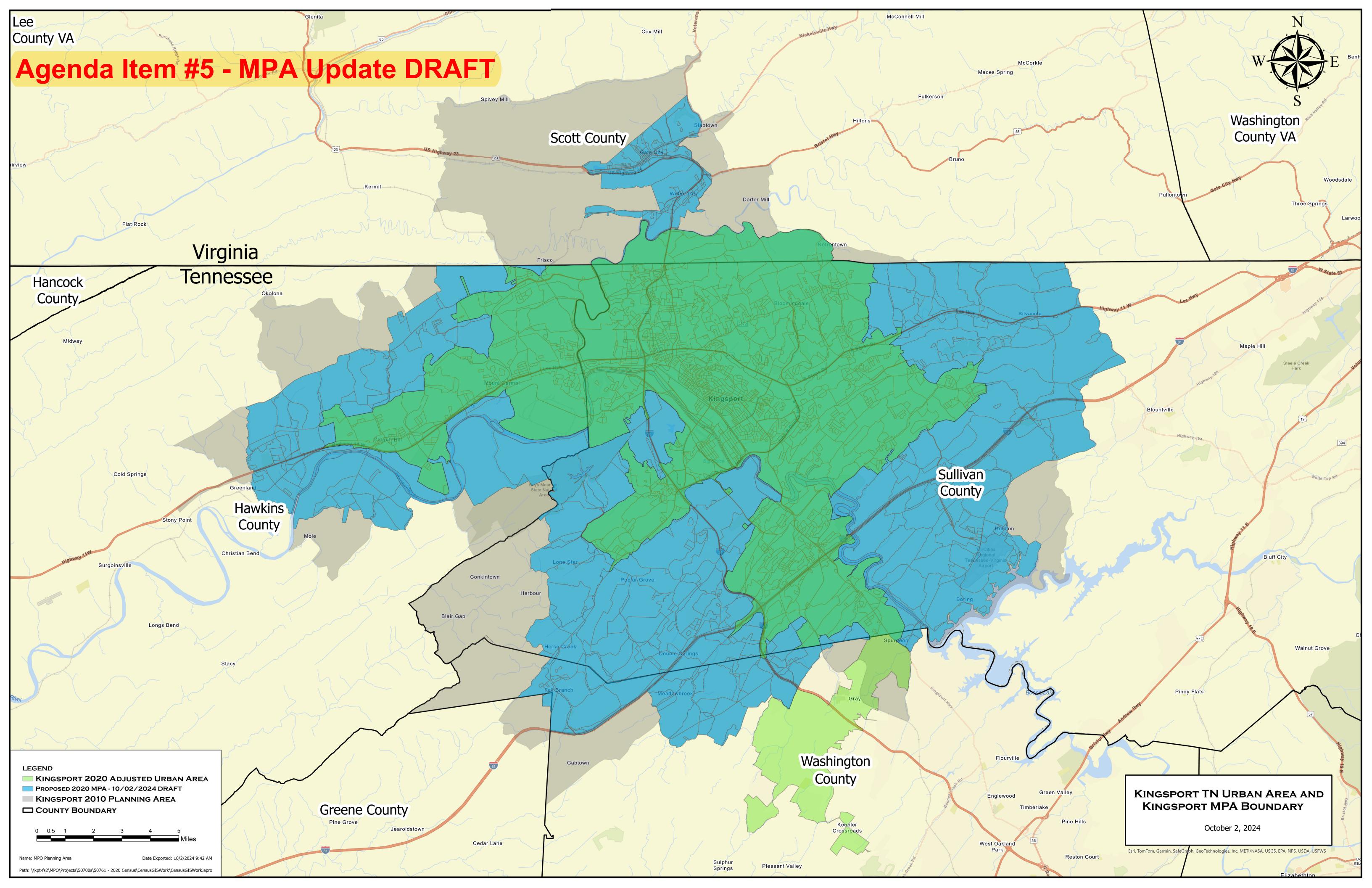

2055 Constrained Long-Range Plan (CLRP)

The CLRP for FY 2025 – 2055 is based on FY 2025 – 2030 Six-Year Financial Plan (SYFP). It also uses the Six-Year Improvement Program (SYIP) adopted by the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) in June 2024. The out years are based on the trends in the current plans and as detailed below.

Revenue

The total nominal (year of expenditure) value of the CLRP is \$349.2 billion. This total includes all funding that would be included in the Commonwealth Transportation Fund (CTF) over the period and includes funding distributed for highways, transit and rail, ports, and airports.

State Revenue

- The average total state revenue growth for FY 2025-2030 is 2.2%.
- With the exception of Fuels Tax, all state revenue is adjusted year over year by the growth rate for each revenue sources between FY 2029 and FY 2030 in the December 2023 state revenue estimates provided by the Department of Taxation with subsequent updates based on the 2022 General Assembly Session.
- Fuel Tax estimate updates were completed with anticipated changes in fuel tax rates as well as estimated changes in consumption. This long-term estimate includes the new adjustment to the tax rate annually, increasing it by the anticipated Consumer Price Index. VDOT staff used data from the Department of Taxation.

Federal Revenue

- The federal revenue estimates are based on the current federal programs authorized under the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) and planned Apportionment and Formula Obligation Authority (OA) provided to Virginia through federal fiscal year 2022.
- Beyond FY 2020, we have assumed a growth rate of 2.0% each year of federal programs.

Allocation of Funds

Methodology for Allocation to Districts and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs)

- Administrative Programs includes the following VDOT program areas:
 - 699 Administrative and Support Services
 - 514 Environmental Monitoring and Evaluation
 - 60315 Construction Management
 - 602 Ground Transportation Planning and Research
- Maintenance allocations include Highway System Maintenance and Operations for VDOT-maintained roads and Financial Assistance for City and County Road Maintenance. These funds are divided amongst the districts based on the district's two-year average share (2024-2025).
- Once district amounts for Maintenance are obtained, population percentages are applied to determine MPO amounts.
- Construction allocations are distributed according to the SYIP detailed distribution for FY 2025-2030 where applicable. Distribution methodologies for State of Good Repair, High Priority Projects, and District Grant Program are described below.
- VDOT specific programs, like Revenue Sharing, were held as statewide amounts and not distributed to the MPOs.
- Special Allocations in Northern Virginia
 - 395 Annual Transit Payment The anticipated Annual Transit Payments have been included with Northern Virginia.
 - Transform66 Efforts
 - I-66 Inside the Beltway Toll Revenue Expectations for available funds for distribution are not incorporated into the CLRP.
 - I-66 Outside the Beltway Project The anticipated Annual Transit Payments have been included with Northern Virginia. Funds for Corridor Improvements are not in the CLRP.

Construction Program Allocation Assumptions

House Bill 1887 from the 2015 General Assembly session implemented funding distribution methodologies that are fully implemented in FY 2021. House Bill 1414 and Senate Bill 890 from the 2020 General Assembly session introduced the Interstate Operations and Enhancement Program (IOEP) and the Virginia Highway Safety Improvement Program to the Construction Program Distribution (§ 33.2-358. Allocation of funds to programs).

- State of Good Repair funding is distributed to VDOT districts based on need and as codified constraints on the distribution among the districts. For the CLRP distribution, the currently assumed needs distribution has been applied over the time period. Beyond FY 2030, the distribution to the MPOs within the district is determined based on population shares within the district.
- **District Grant Program** funding is distributed to VDOT districts based on the codified formulas. For the CLRP distribution, the distribution through FY 2030 is as the Smart Scale Distribution provided with the adoption of the SYIP in June 2024. Beyond FY 2030, the distribution to the MPOs within the district is determined based on population shares within the district.
- **High-Priority Projects Program** funding is available to projects as selected by the Commonwealth Transportation Board. For the CLRP distribution, the distribution through FY 2030 is as the Smart Scale Distribution provided with the adoption of the SYIP in June 2024. Beyond 2030, the distribution follows that of the District Grant Program as has been assumed. The distribution to the MPOs within the district is determined based on the population share within the district.
- Interstate Operations and Enhancement Program funding is available to projects as selected by the Commonwealth Transportation Board. For the CLRP distribution, the distribution through FY 2030 is provided with the adoption of the SYIP in June 2024. Beyond 2030, the distribution to the MPOs is based on their share of Interstate funds from FY 2025-2030
- Virginia Highway Safety Improvement Program funding is available to projects as selected by the Commonwealth Transportation Board. Beyond 2030, the distribution to the MPOs within the district is determined based on the population share within the district.

Comparison to previous Constrained Long Range Plan (CLRP)

The comparison provided below represents the same fiscal year spans that were in the previous CLRP that are also in the current CLRP. These are fiscal years 2025-2055. This comparison does not include funds that are not directly tied to an MPO for this analysis. The total CLRP does contain funds that are not affiliated with an MPO.
